**Emcee**Raoul Martinez



Rachel has twice represented our council at GSUSA's national convention, first as a girl delegate and, years later, as an adult. She leads Junior and Senior Girl Scout troops and is an active participant on our council's adult learning team. When she's not doing Girl Scout activities, Rachel runs half-marathons throughout California.

A fourth-generation Girl Scout, Roni joined Girl Scouts as a Brownie. Over the next 10 years, she shined as a go-getter, innovator, leader, and risk-taker in our Girl Scout community. She mentored younger Girl Scouts and served on the Girl Scout Advisory Board. Roni earned the Girl Scout Bronze, Silver, and Gold awards; the Service Community Service Bar; Senior Service Bar; and Helping Hands Award. Her commitment to leading was recognized when she received the Lifetime Achievement Award for her cumulative cookie sales of over 25,000 boxes. She used her cookie earnings to fund many Girl Scout leadership experiences, including camping in Savannah, surfing in Costa Rica, and backpacking on Mt. Fuji. Roni, an accomplished dancer in ballet and modern dance, is an incoming freshman at UCLA.
