Legacy Circle Spotlight Patti Roscoe and Jim Tiffany



Lower Your Taxable Income with an IRA Charitable Rollover

If you are age 70¹/₂ or older, act now to lower your taxable income for 2013.

The American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012 extended the ability to make a "qualified charitable distribution" from your IRA through 2013. It provides an opportunity to make a nontaxable transfer of up to \$100,000 from your IRA account to gualified charitable organizations. Because your required minimum distribution can be used for this type of transfer, it's an excellent method to reduce taxable income while benefiting a charitable cause.

The IRA Charitable Rollover gift is a simple way to provide for Girl Scouts San Diego. Simply contact your IRA custodian for the proper forms and instructions to get things "rolling."

"Experiences like the cookie program helped me gain invaluable skills while having fun," she explains. "At the time, I didn't notice I was learning marketing, finance, inventory and product delivery. The duo – members of both the Promise Circle and the Legacy Circle – contribute to the success of Girl Scouts San Diego through multiple channels that reach beyond their annual support and planned giving. Most recently, Patti and Jim donated a popular live auction item (dinner for 10 at their beautiful Mission Hills home) for Urban Campout: Sparkles & Spurs.

Cabin 3 at the Balboa Campus is the centerpiece of our popular Adventure Zone. Replacing the current building (now uninhabitable) will provide a safe, larger and more modern facility for more than 5,000 girls and adults annually. Girl Scouts will learn, explore, hold events and camp overnight in Cabin 3, and use it as a base for the Adventure Zone's climbing tower, traverse wall, balance platform, archery range and Groce Family Tree House.

The High Ropes Challenge Course at Camp Winacka will provide exciting opportunities for teambuilding and growth. As they take on the exciting 30' tower, zip line and other elements, girls will gain confidence and build valuable communication, problem solving and critical thinking skills. The challenge course will be a key element in Girl Scouts' outdoor education program, giving today's tech-era girls a chance to connect with nature and each other.

Top 10 Ways to Help Girl Scouts San Diego

- 1. Make a cash contribution.
- 2. Ensure you have an up-to-date will or living trust. Without them, the courts take control of your assets. Just 50% of those who pass away have a current will or trust.
- 3. Leave a specific dollar amount or percentage of the assets in your estate to Girl Scouts.
- 4. Think beyond cash! You can leave stocks, bonds, mutual funds, term deposits, real estate, vehicles, or insurance policies to Girl Scouts.
- 5. Designate Girl Scouts as the beneficiary of your IRA, retirement or pension plan.
- 6. Name Girl Scouts as the beneficiary of your current life insurance policy.
- 7. Purchase a new life insurance policy, naming Girl Scouts as the beneficiary.
- 8. Remember loved ones with a memorial gift that honors their accomplishments, challenges or passions.
- 9. Encourage family members and friends to leave a gift to Girl Scouts in their wills.
- 10. Inquire about planned gifts that return income for life and provide tax deductions.
