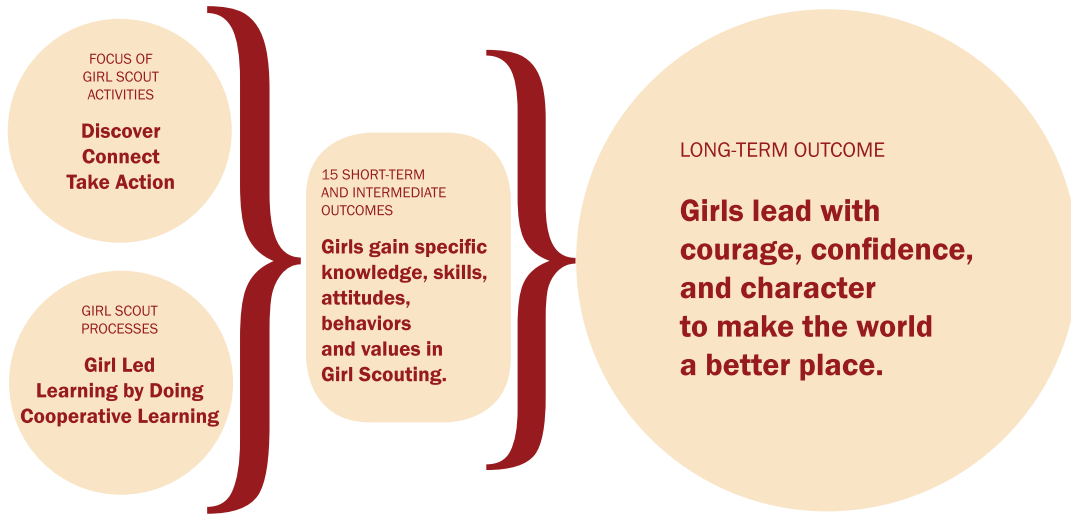

The Girl Scout Leadership Experience

The Girl Scout Leadership Experience provides a program model to develop leadership for all ages.



As adult volunteers, you are an important part of the girl leadership journey... what will leadership look like with your girls this year?

Purposeful • Intentional • Thoughtful • Passionate

Girl/Adult Partnership



Daisy Girl Scouts (Grades K-1) talk with leaders about their ideas for activities.

Brownie Girl Scouts (Grades 2-3) brainstorm ideas and leaders help determine which are possible.

Junior Girl Scouts (Grades 4-5) work in patrols to develop ideas they like best. Leaders help girls realize their goals.

Cadette Girl Scouts (Grades 6,7,8) take a larger role in planning and decision making and adults help when necessary.

Senior Girl Scouts (Grades 9-10) decide what they want to do and how to do it. Leaders are advisors who help as needed.

Ambassador Girl Scouts (Grades 11-12) rotate leadership tasks and plan activities, budgets, and goals. Advisors guide as needed.

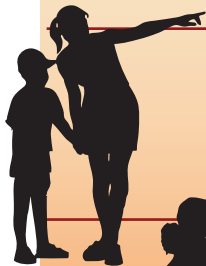

Class Descriptions and Fees

PROGRAM LEVEL TRAINING

New Leader Orientation must be completed prior to taking Program Level training. All classes are 3 hours.

Member fee: \$5 **Non-member fee:** \$17 (includes cost of Girl Scout membership)

Pre-course assignment: A program class pre-course will be mailed along with confirmation of course placement. If you have not received the pre-course, please call Jennifer Peurifoy at (619) 610-0728. Please bring the pre-course with you to class.

DAISY (Grades K-1)

Explore the world of Girl Scouts

Daisies! Work with the Daisy level program resources—*Journeys, Guide for Daisy Girl Scout Leaders* and *Daisy Girl Scout Activity Book*. Key topics include planning the year using the program outcomes, activities for girls of this age, engaging other adults, and basic health and safety standards.

BROWNIE (Grades 2-3)

Discover the magic of Girl Scout

Brownies! Explore the Brownie level program materials—*Journeys, Brownie Girl Scout Try-It Book and Handbook* and *Guide for Brownie Girl Scout Leaders*. Additional topics include purposeful leadership, program outcomes, girl/adult partnership, Brownie-appropriate leadership development, the Brownie Ring, and resources for songs, games, and program activities.

JUNIOR (Grades 4-5)

Connect with Girl Scout Juniors as they take action!

Discussions will focus on the adult/girl partnership, planning and how to support girls in developing their leadership skills by using current program materials—*Journeys, Junior Girl Scout Badge Book and Handbook* and *Guide for Junior Girl Scout Leaders*. The class will also include dialogue on purposeful leadership, program outcomes and program pathways such as badges and new 2009/2010 Bronze Awards guidelines.

CADETTE (Grades 6-8)

How do you keep junior high school girls in Girl Scouting? Find out how to use the current program resources—*Journeys, Girl and Adult handbooks, and Interest Project Book* to keep the girls interested

and having fun. The class will focus on improving the adult/girl partnership, girl planning and how to support girls in developing their leadership skills. The class will also review the new 2009/2010 Silver Award guidelines.

SENIOR (Grades 9-10)

AMBASSADOR (Grades 11-12)

Explore the world of high school Girl Scout Seniors and Girl Scout

Ambassadors! Use the current program resources—*Journeys, Girl and Adult Handbooks* and *Interest Project Book* for each program level. Key topics include purposeful leadership, program outcomes, program activities, recognitions, destinations, troop/group management, service, leadership, progression and the new 2009/2010 Gold Award guidelines.

OUTDOOR TRAINING

Classes must be completed in order:

1) Let's Camp!, 2) Let's Cook! and 3) Let's Tent! All classes (except where noted)

Member Fee: \$5 **Non-Member Fee:** \$17 (includes cost of Girl Scout membership)

LET'S CAMP! (1)

Ready for outdoor adventure? After completing this first course in the outdoor training series and experiencing at least one overnight experience with your troop, you and your girls should be ready for:

- Service unit encampments with all prepared meals and preplanned program.
- No-cook meal preparation. Adults do any cooking.
- Council adventure weekends.

This course prepares leaders to assist girls with girl planning, indoor overnights, outdoor progression, trip planning, safety and program activities.

Pre-course assignment: Let's Camp! pre-course will be mailed along with confirmation of course placement. If you have not received the pre-course, please call Michelle Amstutz at (619) 610-0737.

Course length: 3.5 hours

Bring: Complete pre-course

LET'S COOK! (2)

Interested adults who have completed Let's Camp! and are ready to take their troop/group to the next level will enjoy this class. Let's Cook! builds on the skills and safety guidelines introduced in Let's Camp! The Let's Cook! class participants will work in patrols to learn to cook using charcoal fires and propane stoves, menu planning, environmental impact and girl planning. During Let's Cook! Part 1, planning is done for a Let's Cook! Part 2 cook out with actual hands-on experience; participants bring personal gear and share food cost. Also covered are outdoor progression, girl behavior, trip planning, safety, weekend and cabin camping skills and program activities.

This **two-part** course must be taken with the same session groups (parts 1 & 2). Additional time is required outside of class to prepare between Part 1 and Part 2. (9½ hrs total)

Pre-requisite: Let's Camp!

Bring: Outdoor Training Notebook

LET'S TENT! (3)

Let's Tent! will open up the adventures of tent camping with your girls! Leaders and interested adults who have completed Let's Camp! and Let's Cook! may register for this overnight class which will prepare you for tent camping with your troop/group and includes safety, rustic outdoor living skills in tents, environmental considerations and proper equipment. The experience will include campfire program, night activities, stargazing, lashing and trail signs activities.

Pre-requisite: Let's Camp! and Let's Cook!

Note: This overnight course must be completed to receive a "tent certification."

Pre-course assignment: Let's Tent! pre-course will be mailed along with confirmation of course placement. If you have not received the pre-course, please call Michelle Amstutz at (619) 610-0737.

Bring: Completed Let's Tent pre-course, Outdoor Training Notebook

CHALLENGE COURSE

The Challenge Course at Whispering Oaks is a wonderful resource for our Girl Scouts and is enjoyed by all! Through this class, learn how to safely use the

Challenge Course with a troop. Arrive 30 minutes prior to the start of class. Park at Whispering Oaks, check in at the lodge, and walk to the course. A minimum of 10 participants is required to hold this course. Certification is valid for four years. **Note:** Re-certification is held first hour of each class.

Bring: water, wear comfortable clothing
Course length: 5 hours

COOK'S CHECKOUT

Adults (over 18) planning to use the kitchen at Whispering Oaks or Camp Winacka for a service unit encampment or other community camping event must attend this class. This is a complete course in the use of the commercial kitchen at the mountain properties, including practice with equipment and creating menus for larger groups. The class also includes two hours of cooking tips and recipes, and three hours of practice. Class is limited to three trainees per session. Registration will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

Course length: 5 hours

ARCHERY INSTRUCTOR

Archery is truly a beloved part of the outdoor experience! This training will permit you to teach your girls archery safely by meeting the Safety-Wise standard for Archery Instructor's Certification (3-year certification). All materials needed for training are provided. Feel free to bring a sack lunch; there is no place on-site to purchase food during the class break. Leaders, assistant leaders and interested adults (18 years and older) are welcome to attend.

Bring: Sack lunch, water

Course length: 8 hours

Member fee: \$25 **Non-member fee:** \$37 (includes Girl Scout membership)

WILDERNESS HIKING

The Wilderness Hiking class is a one day experience for girls and adults to learn the foundational skills for long-term hiking and trail usage. This class is the pre-requisite for the Basic and Advanced Backpacking trips. You must complete this class and two additional day hikes for certification. ENRICHMENT TRAINING

All classes (except where noted)

Member fee: \$5 **Non-member fee:** \$17 (includes cost of Girl Scout membership)

LEADERSHIP ESSENTIALS

Join us for a hands-on exploration of the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE). New and veteran leaders will discover how to apply the model to what you do with your girls. This class focuses on your own personal leadership progression and working with the Journeys to support girl leadership development.

Course length: 3 hours

BRONZE AWARD BASICS

Junior leaders and interested adults are invited to a presentation of the updated 2009/2010 Bronze Award guidelines. The Bronze Award requirements, Girl Scout Leadership Experience and Junior level journeys will be discussed.

Note: Adults only

Course length: 2 hours

*Facilitators will be available after class for a Q & A session, if needed.

SILVER AND GOLD AWARD BASICS

Participants will explore the updated 2009/2010 guidelines for each award including an overview of the award program and discussion breakout sessions for each award level. All requirements to complete each award including appropriate age level journey will be discussed.

Note: Adults and girls are scheduled at the same time and location, but will meet separately. Please register each person separately.

Course length: 2 hours

*Facilitators will be available after class for a Q & A session, if needed.

THE GOLD AWARD PROJECT WORKSHOP

This workshop is designed **just for girls** who have already completed the initial steps toward earning Girl Scouting's highest awards. Bring Gold project proposals to the workshop and meet with advisors and other adults who will coach you through the process of envisioning, planning and writing up your proposal. Learn how to formulate ideas, connect with local resources, and find out about

all of the necessary paperwork, including the final report form.

This class is designed for girls (no adults please) that have completed the initial steps in the Girl Scout Gold Award "Go For It!" and will complete their award under those guidelines. CPR/FIRST AID

This Advanced Health and Safety Training course meets the requirements for a First Aider Level 1. Successful completion earns a two-year certificate.

Course length: 5 hours (CPR: 5:30 – 8:15 p.m.; First Aid: 8:15-10:30 p.m.)

Member fee: \$45 (CPR and First Aid); \$20 for First Aid only, \$30 for CPR only

Non-member fee: \$57 (CPR and First Aid); (includes cost of Girl Scout membership)

BABYSITTING

(Cadette, Senior and Ambassador Girls) This is a fun course filled with activities and learning about safety, play, basic childcare, First Aid, leadership and caregiving skills. Participants will receive the Babysitter's Handbook and certification upon completion.

- Non-members will be charged an additional \$12 for training classes and become registered Girl Scouts for the current year. This allows them to be covered by liability insurance and have the opportunity to enjoy other benefits of Girl Scout membership.
- Registrations sent without payment, or a request of financial assistance will not be processed.

Refunds

- Cancellations received in writing 10 business days prior to class are eligible for 100% refund.
- Attendees that provide advance notification when cancelling out of a class may transfer payment to an other class only once. Transfer must be done in the same calendar year.
- Refunds requested for less than \$10, originally paid by check or cash will be sent in Council Bucks.
- All credit card payments requiring refunds will be credited back to the card used for original payment.
