What's Different This Year?

We are so excited to be back in-person at Camp Winacka for Outdoor Skills Weekend! Here's what's different this time:

Meals and group gatherings are back in the Winacka Lodge! This mainstay of Camp Winacka is open again after considereable and much—needed upgrades.

Friday night activities. Once you're settled, make your way to the Winacka Lodge for fun dropin activities and connecting with friends. If you've brought a Friday night meal, you can enjoy it there too.

Limited parking is available at Camp Winacka with more spaces available at Camp Whispering Oaks. For safety, there is no parking along the main road at Camp Winacka or behind the Winacka Environmental Center or Winacka Lodge.

COVID-19 guidance. Wearing a mask is optional when outdoors. Indoor masking depends on county guidelines at the time of the event. Masks will be recommended indoors if San Diego County is in a "medium" or "high" community level. Updates will be provided during the event, as needed.

Be a sister to every Girl Scout. Check in with each other about masking and close contact comfort levels. Camp is the best place to live and breathe the Girl Scout Promise and Law!

- Hat for shade/warmth

- Sunglasses
- Bandana
- Gloves*
- Two pairs of closed-toe shoes
- Towel, washcloth, and soap
- Toothpaste, toothbrush, hairbrush, and other toiletries
- · Sunscreen, insect repellant
- · Any medications you take
- Pajamas
- Flip flops (for shower use only)
- · Daypack/fanny pack
- · Something to take notes
- Camera, binoculars, or book*
- · Small first aid kit

Camp Etiquette

At camp, all Girl Scouts come together to create a warm and welcoming community. This weekend, we hope you'll make new friends, reconnect with old ones, and explore more. Sharing and growing together is what this weekend is all about!

To ensure everyone has a great experience, please respect these basic principles of camp etiquette:

- · Leave spaces cleaner than you found them.
- · Respect the space and equipment of others.
- Observe quiet time (10 p.m.-6:30 a.m.) and respect others' need for sleep.
- Stay on marked paths and trails—leave no trace.
- Make sure to perform your selected kapers before you leave on Sunday!



Camp Safety

Keep your Adult Health History Form on you at all times in your name badge holder. We will not collect these this year, but should you require medical assistance, we will expect to find the form with you.

Take care of your minor first aid. If you don't have training yet, there's probably someone close by to lend a hand.

A first aider will be on hand for serious injury or illness. Staff with walkie talkies can contact the first aider on your behalf, if needed. First aid kits and call boxes to reach assistance are available in each sleeping unit. All camp buildings also have first aid kits available.

Attend the safety drill Saturday morning. Learn the emergency info you'll need while on property.

Back your car into your parking spot. Keep your car keys with you at all times. Both of these measures help us to evacuate quickly should the need arise. There is no parking along the main road at Winacka.

If you go off-property for an unscheduled hike, early morning run, or other trip, please check out at the Geico Reception Center so we know where you are (and use the buddy system!). Don't forget to sign back in when you return.

Alcohol is not permitted at camp; please refrain this weekend.

Smoking is only allowed at designated smoking sections; please check with camp hosts to learn about designated smoking areas.

Friday Night Fun (4-8 p.m.)

Around Camp Winacka, you'll find fun drop-in actitivies:

- **Shopping.** Visit the Girl Scouts San Diego Pop-Up Store at the Geico Reception Center Friday from 4–8 p.m. or Saturday from 8 a.m.–5 p.m. to pick up your favorite GSSD merchandise.
- **Leather stamping and knot tying.** Keep your hands busy with friends new and old in the Winacka Lodge.
- **Learn from legacy leaders.** Come together with seasoned Girl Scouts volunteers to chat about their experiences on all things outdoors with Girl Scouts in the Winacka Lodge.





Saturday and Sunday Group Activities

- **Safety Drill.** We'll meet as a group to review the safety procedures in case of an emergency at camp. This is required for all to attend.
- **Flag Ceremonies.** Flag up and flag down are traditional Girl Scouts flag ceremonies to start and close the day.
- **SWAPS Exchange.** This optional activity will take place at the Winacka Flag Pole after flag down on Saturday, prior to dinner. However, feel free to share throughout the weekend!
- **Campfire Program.** Join us for a warm fire, bright stars, full hearts, and s'mores with this beloved Girl Scout tradition.
- Lumbercycle Demonstration. Lumbercycle seeks to divert woody biomass from landfills by milling fallen trees into lumber and reinvesting it back into communities, including at camp! This engaging session will feature sustainability efforts, detail the life cycle of a tree, and even include a live sawmill demonstration.
- Girl Scouts' Own. This traditional Girl Scouts ceremony using spoken word, favorite songs, poetry, and more will help us wrap up our time at Outdoor Skills Weekend at Singing Tree. Be sure to stay for carpool drawings for an Apple Alley Bakery gift card.

Time to Head Home

Sleeping Unit Kapers for All Attendees

A "kaper" is camp lingo for a chore or responsibility. All attendees should assist in the clean-up of their sleeping unit as well as adjacent restrooms. Cleaning supplies and equipment are kept in unit closets. Please return any item used to its proper place.

Plan to complete these kapers after Sunday breakfast, before the Lumbercycle Demonstraion and Girl Scouts' Own Ceremony and before you check out:

- · Clean and scour all sinks and toilets.
- · Empty sanitary napkin receptacles.
- Conduct a trash sweep around unit, including under mattresses and common areas. Bring lost items to the Geico Reception Center.
- · Put all trash in outside trash receptacles.
- Sweep floors in cabins, under beds, porches, common areas, and bathrooms.
- Mop bathrooms and the floors in modern units.
- · Do a final inspection to ensure everything was done.
- · Close all windows and doors.
- Turn off lights and heat (when applicable).

Communal Kapers

In addition to sleeping unit kapers, all attendees are expected to contribute to the smooth running of camp with a communal kaper. You should have signed up for a kaper through SignUpGenius after you registered for Outdoor Skills Weekend. If not, add your name to one of the printed lists in the Geico Reception Center.
