Recognitions TaskGroup

Overview

The Recognitions Task Group (RTG) is a group of four to six outstanding Girl Scouts San Diego volunteers who review, discuss and approve nominations for council level and Girl Scouts USA (GSUSA) awards to be presented at the annual Volunteer Celebration.

Responsibilities

Each membership year, Girl Scouts San Diego hosts Volunteer Celebration where volunteers are celebrated for their outstanding efforts from the previous Girl Scout Year. Those honorees selected by the RTG are presented council-level and GSUSA awards from Girl Scouts San Diego staff.

The RTG is the core group of volunteers that analyzes each nomination and its two endorsements and decides who has reached all criteria to earn a council-level or GSUSA award.

Apart from honoree selection, the RTG may also be contacted throughout the Girl Scout year by the volunteer recognition specialist concerning edits to the selection process, educating members of service units on the nomination process and other questions or duties.

Time of Duty

The RTG begins meeting about four months prior to the Celebration, about two weeks after nominations close to the public. These meetings are usually conducted once to twice a week until all decisions are made by the group. This process takes about two months.

Each member commits to a two-year term on the RTG.

Positions

Members-The RTG consists of four to six members. These members are the core group of volunteers who decide which potential honorees have earned recognition at that year's Volunteer Celebration.

Chair-One member of the RTG is chosen by the Volunteer Recognition Specialist to be the liaison between him or her and the RTG throughout the Girl Scout year. This person is the go to for any questions that may not need the involvement of the entire RTG.

Becoming a Member

After the celebration, the volunteer recognition specialist and RTG will meet and discuss volunteers who have either expressed interest in becoming a task group member or would make agreat fit and are open to learning about the opportunity. These volunteers will then attend an RTG meeting and decide if this group is the right fit for them.
