1. The first organization started by Juliette Gordon Low was called:

On March 12, 1912, Juliette Low gathered 18 girls to register the first troop of American Girl Guides. Margaret "Daisy Doots" Gordon, her niece and namesake, was the first registered member. The name of the organization was changed to Girl Scouts the following year. (girlscouts.org)

2. The first national office of the Girl Scouts was located in:

A. Washington, DC B. Savannah, GA

C. New York City, NY

While the Girl Scout Headquarters has always been in Savannah, GA, the first national office of the Girl Scouts was located in Washington, DC.

3. Adults in charge of the first Girl Scout troop were called:

Since Girl Scout adults once earned badges and wore the same uniform, with badges and ranks sewn on just like the girls, they were given a different name — Captain — to identify them.

In those first years, the uniforms the girls wore were modeled after those of the Girl Guides of England. The girls, their mothers and the Girl Scout Captains fashioned the patterns and made the uniforms themselves. The uniforms were sewn from a dark-blue cotton duck material.
