What is the Girl Scout Gold Award:

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the most prestigious award that Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts can earn. Each Gold Award project solves community issues and improves lives. The Gold Award process builds personal leadership skills and inspires others to take action within their communities.

The Role of a Gold Award Committee Mentor:

The Gold Award Committee supports Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts in achieving the Girl Scout Gold Award. They meet monthly to review project proposals and offer guidance to ensure high-caliber projects are approved. Committee members mentor their Gold Award candidates, providing coaching and guidance throughout the process. They also take opportunities to educate the community about the Gold Award.

Time Commitment

As a Gold Award committee member, you commit to:

- Attending our monthly, virtual committee meeting on the second Tuesday evening of every month.
- Coaching and supporting a roster of Gold Award candidates from pre-proposal through final report over at least a two-year time frame.
- Some months your commitment will be closer to 1-2 hours and sometimes it could exceed 10 hours.
- This volunteer position is a 3 year commitment.

Key Qualifications:

Strong communication skills with a knack for connecting with teen Girl Scouts.

Ability to collaborate with their peers on the Gold Award Committee.

Flexibility and tenacity to coach girls to help them understand the Gold Award process and project expectations.

Passion for promoting, educating and fostering the Gold Award in the community.

Additional Requirements:

Become a Gold Award process and project expert.

Be a registered adult (minimum age 18) member in good standing, with current volunteer paperwork and background clearance on file.

Affirm that the Girl Scout movement actively seeks members of every racial, ethnic, religious and socioeconomic group.

Comply with Girl Scouts of the USA and Girl Scouts San Diego council standards, policies, procedures, and guidelines.
